## DANIEL'S UNDAUNTED COURAGE

#### C. H. Spurgeon

"Now when Daniel knew that the writing was signed, he went into his house; and his windows being open in his chamber towards Jerusalem, he kneeled upon his knees three times a day, and prayed, and gave thanks before his God, as he did aforetime." Daniel 6:10

Daniel prayed 'three times a day'. That does not tell you how often he prayed, but how often he was in the posture of prayer. Doubtless he prayed three hundred times a day if necessary; his heart was always having commerce with the skies. But 'three times a day' he prayed formally. We usually take three meals in the day and it is well to give the soul as many meals as the body. We want the morning's guidance and the evening's forgiveness, but do we not also require the noontide's refreshment? Might we not well say at noontide, 'Tell me, O thou whom my soul loveth, where thou feedest, where thou makest thy flock to rest at noon'. It is well to keep in the spirit of Keble's hymn— 'Abide with me from morn till eve.' If you find from morn till eve too long an interval between prayer, put in another golden link at midday. There is no rule in Scripture as to how often and when you should pray; it is left to the man's own gracious spirit. We need not come back to the bondage of the Mosaic covenant, to be under rule and rubric; we are left to that free Spirit who leads his saints aright. Yet 'three times a day' is a commendable number. Notice secondly the posture. That also is of little consequence, since we read in Scripture of men who prayed on the bed with their face to the wall. We read of David sitting before the Lord. How very common and acceptable a posture was that of standing before God in prayer! Yet there is a peculiar appropriateness, especially in private prayer, in the posture of kneeling. It seems to say, 'I cannot stand upright before thy majesty; I am a beggar and I put myself in the position of a beggar; I sue of thee, great God, on bended knee, in the posture of one who owns that he deserves nothing, but humbles himself before thy gracious majesty.'

For meditation: See David's prayer-timetable in Psalm 55:16-17. Do you live that closely to God or is once a day too much effort? The Lord Jesus Christ taught his disciples to pray always (Luke 18:1) and the apostle Paul emphasized this to the early church (Ephesians 6:18; 1 Thessalonians 5:17).


